19mo-3 years	Fall and Spring/ Hour 1	<u>Toddler Time: Circle Time</u> Play and songs combine in this class to form a fun circle time where basic concepts like weather, letters, and more will be introduced.
	Fall and Spring/Hour 2	<u>Toddler Time:Morning Basket</u> Books, crafts, and toys will be set out to create an invitation to play with this fun busy age group.
4k/5k	Fall/ Hour 1	<u>A to Z: Letter of the Week</u> Each week a different letter will be explored through crafts, letter building, and writing. Students are to bring something that starts with the letter of the week each week to present to their peers to begin working on presentation skills. What a fun way to work on letters in a group setting with friends! This class will last both semesters.
	Fall/ Hour 2	<u>Ready! Set! Build!</u> This beginning STEM class will challenge students' visual perception, fine motor, and creativity skills when building with duplo blocks. They will build designs from a picture, create based on a theme and work together as a team to accomplish a goal.
	Spring/ Hour 1	<u>A to Z: Letter of the Week</u> Each week a different letter will be explored through crafts, letter building, and writing. Like Isaiah's answer to God's question in Isaiah 6, these men and women also answered with 'Here am I, Send me!' Geography, culture, and maybe even some foreign language will be studied.
